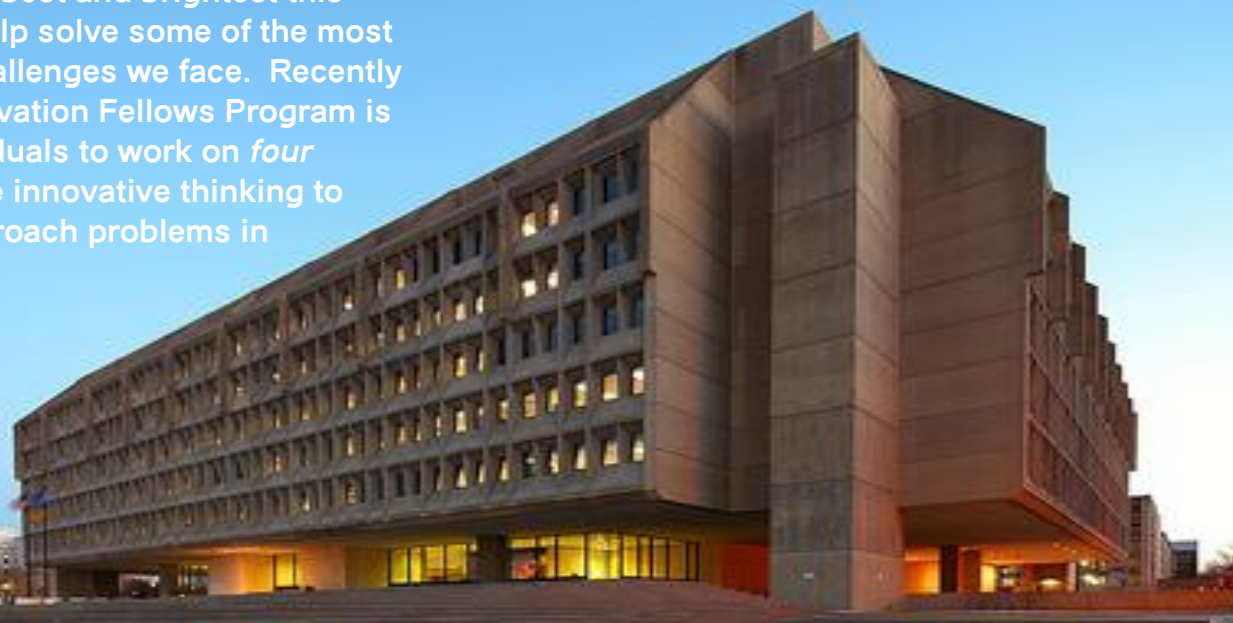


The chance to make the biggest difference in people's lives may be the year you spend at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services
